

the mumnun standard for training. Purpose: To ensure all tirelighters and otheres responding to emergencies within the Township of Upper Providence meet

Scope: ALL personnel who participate in the lighting and rescue activities shall be required to conform to this policy. All companies must have at least 75% of its active membership meet the firefighter requirements and ALL Fire Officers must meet 100% of the required training for the position to which they are elected or appointed within 1 year of the effective date of this policy. Nothing in this document shall prevent or prohibit any fire company from implementing training standards or qualifications that are in excess of the minimum requirements listed in this document.

Junior Firefighters

have the following training as a minimum in order to ride on departmental apparatus: Junior firefighters are members who are sixteen (16) and seventeen (17) years of age. All Department Junior firefighters shall

- Introduction to the Fire Service
- Fire Ground Support
- Exterior Firefighter OR equivalent.
- Hazardous Materials Awareness OR equivalent (NFPA 472). If the date of completion is over one year, a current Hazardous Materials Awareness Refresher Course is needed.
- Current First Aid and CPR certification.
- Junor firefighters shall be immted to those duties allowed by the Pennsylvania State child labor laws
- Junor fretighters shall be identified by one or more of the following helmet markings:
- Red helmet
- Fire Company helmet with red stupping and "Junor Firefighter" rockers Traditional style Fire Company helmet with red stupes and a red front shield

- Aerial Apparatus Practices (if company has an aerial apparatus NIMS 100, 200, 700, 800 (NIMS 300 & 400 are encouraged)
- Rescue I of NFPA 1006 CORE (if company provides rescue services
